Like graceful dancers, there are times in our lives when we seem to glide effortlessly across the floor. There are also times when our feet are leaden, and inspiration and creativity elude us. With each step we take, if we listen carefully enough, we can hear a quiet voice far off in the distance. As mercurial and vaporous as a gossamer dream, we sense that we have glimpsed something eternal – perhaps even an intimation of our destiny. Our lives are profoundly influenced by archetypal rhythms, and it is essential that we learn more about these forces which bring us both closer to and farther from the life we are meant to live.

We will explore the archetypal underpinnings of life through dreams, cinema, wisdom tales and world events. Our discussion will focus on the nature of archetypal dynamics and ways to recognize and understand these patterns in our lives.

We will be reminded that transcendence is accessed through a meaningful relationship to the Self.

At some point in life, each of us wrestles with the need to let go of outdated attitudes so as to courageously embrace a meaningful future. The ineffable and the transcendent will only be experienced as we continue to move beyond the confines of these outdated attitudes and values.

In the Red Book, we find Jung struggling for freedom from such archetypal Gods. Here he allows us to see the power these archetypal forces have on us. They can pull us toward stagnation and regression, holding us captive. Until, that is, we can find a means toward liberation and a way to the Self.

Through a discussion of the working of archetypes and complexes, we will see how transpersonal influences literally take hold of a personality, denying us a future we can live into. Fortunately, we can learn from our spiritual traditions, literature, folklore and dreams and find a path toward liberation and the transcendent. Through the lens of history and contemporary life, we will see how it is that these Gods are dethroned, and how we can more fully join the chorus in singing – *The King has died – Long live the King!*
