Week Three: The Work, The Tower and Travels, Visions

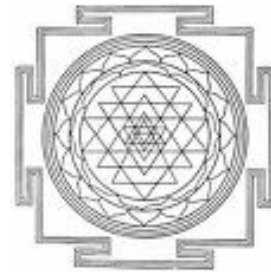
Week Four: On Life After Death, and Late Thoughts
