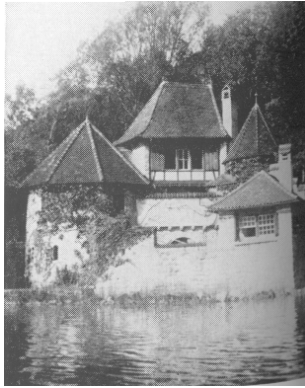

For Jung, getting to know the shadow, “the thing a person has no wish to be,” is a way of embracing and redeeming all the rejected and lost parts of the soul.

Although the shadow may have a sinister and guilt-ridden quality, Jung never intended the shadow to get the bad reputation it has. The shadow only seems “bad” because it holds all the unacceptable and inferior parts of us.

If anything, Jung saw the shadow more as a treasure hidden in a field, a potential source of richness that is unavailable to us as long as it is buried or unconscious. We need to rethink our attitude toward the shadow, “that which we have no wish to be,” because it contains that which will make us whole.
