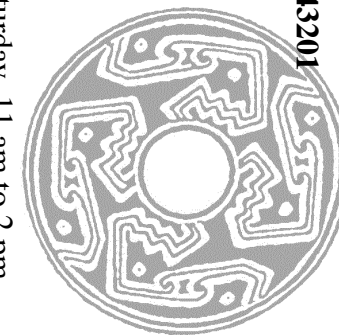

Deldon Anne McNeely

The C. G. Jung Association of Central Ohio is honored to welcome Deldon Anne McNeely as our 2007 Bollingen presenter.

Dr. McNeely is a diplomate in Clinical Psychology with a Ph.D. from Louisiana State University. She studied at the Jung Institute in Zurich and graduated from the Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts, where she now serves in the training program. She maintains a private analytic practice in Virginia Beach where she makes her home.

She is on the staff of the New Orleans seminar in Jungian Psychology and is a patron to the Baton Rouge Jung Society. Dr. McNeely was trained in dance and body therapies by Malcolm Brown, Gabrielle Roth, Carolyn Fay and others. She has been interested in group and couples therapy, and was active in training group therapists before beginning her analytic study.

Her books include *Touching: Body Therapy and Depth Psychology*; *Animus Aeternus: Images of the Inner Masculine*; and *Mercury Rising: Women, Evil and the Trickster Gods*.

Dr. McNeely comes to us highly recommended.

Archetypes of Relatedness



There is much about intimacy and relatedness that is still a mystery to us in the 21st century. We are still evolving a capacity to form lasting and satisfying intimate relationships.

We long to form deeper bonds of love first with ourselves, then with those closest to us, to our neighbors and even to our enemies. Unconscious factors and archetypal patterns influence our ability to know true relatedness.

How do we prepare ourselves and our children for intimate relationships? What psychological barriers to trust and constancy can we eliminate?

How do we maintain constructive attitudes toward loss and separation? How are our anima and animus projections affecting our relationships?

Neuroscience is giving us so much new information about the brain and our heart (or capacity for true relationship). How can we keep brain and heart working together for the benefit of both?

Friday Evening Lecture: Intimacy and Commitment in Relationship

The lecture will speak to this topic through images of Dionysus, a god of intimacy and passion, as well as through the insights of depth psychology and the other sciences. How do we approach, enter, and maintain relationships?
