She was Chair and Core Faculty of the MA Counseling Psychology Program at Pacifica Graduate Institute and currently teaches in the Depth Psychology Program at Sonoma State University. She is the author of the best-selling book *The Heroine's Journey*, as well as the newly revised *Father's Daughters: Breaking the Ties that Bind*; *Unreliable Truth: On Memoir and Memory*; *Spinning Inward: Using Guided Imagery with Children*; and *The Heroine's Journey Workbook*. She edited an anthology entitled *Monday Morning Memoirs: Women in the Second Half of Life*, and her books have been translated into 11 languages. She gives lectures and workshops internationally. Black Madonna as Portal to the Sacred Feminine A Lecture and Slide Presentation



Dark images of the Divine Mother have a long tradition in Eastern religions and in European Catholicism. Although there are over 400 Black Madonnas in France alone, they are relatively unknown and misunderstood. The Black Madonna, with her dark, unconscious, mysterious nature, is the embodiment of the feminine face of God. She is the symbol of the feminine giving birth to the unconscious spiritual aspect of herself. The Black Madonna is both a source of new consciousness and the wellspring of all creativity.

This slide lecture and discussion will address the lineage of the Black Madonna from ancient goddess traditions to the present, with specific focus on the Black Madonnas whom Murdock has visited on pilgrimage at Le Puy, Rocamadour, Montserrat and Einsiedeln.

The Heroine's Journey: Healing the Deep Wounding of the Feminine

Joseph Campbell's model of the mythological journey of the hero has been used as a template for psycho-spiritual development since 1949. This model, however, did not address the task for today's woman, which is to heal the deep wounding of the feminine that exists within herself and the culture.

The search for material success in a world governed by masculine values has left both men and women wondering what happened to their spiritual nature.



In *The Heroine's Journey* workshop on Saturday, we will explore the stages of the journey developed by Maureen Murdock which redefines the heroic quest for women.

This journey entails an initial separation from feminine values, succeeding within the values of a patriarchal culture, experiencing aridity and death, and finally turning inward to reclaim the power and spirit of the Goddess. The final stages of the journey include redefining feminine values, healing the wounded masculine and finding balance within both aspects of our nature. This workshop will involve presentation of the model of the Heroine's Journey, discussion, storytelling and myth.

The workshop will be enriching for both men and women, who carry these issues in different ways, and for therapists working with both women and men.
