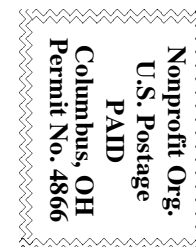

J. Marvin Spiegelman, Ph.D.

Dr. Spiegelman has traveled widely, both literally and in terms of his interests and friendships. He holds a Ph.D. in clinical and social psychology from UCLA. He is a diplomate of the C.G. Jung Institute in Zurich, and is certified by the American Board of Professional Psychology. He has been in private practice as a Jungian analyst since 1959, and has authored both fiction and non-fiction works that explore the relationship of Jungian psychology to world religious traditions.



Encountering the Divine: A Jungian Exploration of Spiritual Paths *Within, Among, Between, Around*

JACO's 2005 Bollingen Lecturer, Dr. J. Marvin Spiegelman, will develop a framework for understanding how world religious traditions connect with the divine. There are two purposes for this exploration; to help individuals find their own spiritual path and to discover the territory within the psyche that is the common ground of all spiritual traditions.

Throughout the Friday evening and Saturday workshops, Dr. Spiegelman will illustrate how specific religious paths have found the divine by exploring the soul *within*, by the communal path (*among*), by the mutual process of alchemy and Jungian psychology (*between*), and through the numinous that surrounds us in nature, art and experience (*around*). By looking at all forms of religious expression, their origins in the psyche, and the transformations that can come through the religious instinct, participants will more clearly see their own path and unfold their own myth.
