

The Soul as Transformative Process

We are apt to forget that matters of the soul are processes of experience, that is, transformations, which should not be unequivocally designated if one does not want to petrify the living movement into something static.

Carl G. Jung, Alchemical Studies, par. 199

In his search to understand the nature of soul, or psyche, Jung found surprising assistance from medieval alchemy in its portrayal of soul as a naturally transformative process. Jung's theory of soul finds additional support today from new science, modern psychoanalytic theory and studies of mysticism.

In this program we will explore the transformative dynamics of the soul as they manifest in our individual and relational experiences, as well as in nature itself. We also consider the role of attachment and detachment in the process of transformation.

The Bollingen lecture was named after the "confession of faith in stone," as Jung called his tower – the house he built for himself at Bollingen. Over the years, as he would begin to feel the house was incomplete, he would add rooms and courtyards, even an upper story. Jung said he felt most deeply himself at Bollingen.

This program develops in depth the notions of attachment and detachment with particular attention to major alchemical processes as they are reflected symbolically in art, dream material and our own life experiences.

To Jung, the central alchemical notions of *conjunctio* and *separatio* clarified the significance of attachment and detachment in spiritual and psychological development. These dynamics find their corollary in the mystical processes classically called the *via positiva* and via *negativa*.
